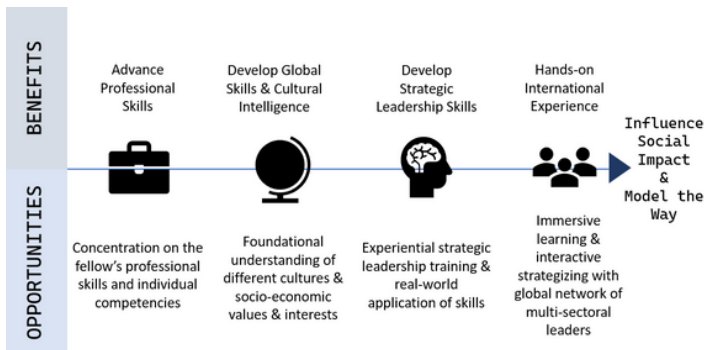

TIMELINE

Unlike our 1-year traditional GLF program, this fast track program model allows students to complete the fellowship program in 7-8 months through an immersive and intensive experience. Recruitment of upper division students at a higher education institution typically starts at the beginning of the calendar year.
